The Friend of Singa Award

- ♥ The Friend of Singa (FOS) is now into its 23rd year running and continues to promote the essential values of selflessness and love behind the kind acts of young caring individuals.
- ♥ Since its revamp in 2009, all participants have to complete a kindness project within their school community over a 6 month period. These projects should create an impact within the school community and have meaningful effects on students' behaviours.
- ♥ To help kick start these projects, the Singapore Kindness Movement funds up to \$150 per project.
- ♥ The theme of this year's competition is "empathy".

♥ School selects up to 8 students for the FOS programme.



♥ All FOS participants attended a workshop on either 23/24 February or 5/9 March 2012. The workshops equipped the students and teachers with public speaking and project management skills.

♥ The students then identified areas where social graces are lacking and came up with a creative solution to tackle the problem. They had up to 6 months to complete their project.

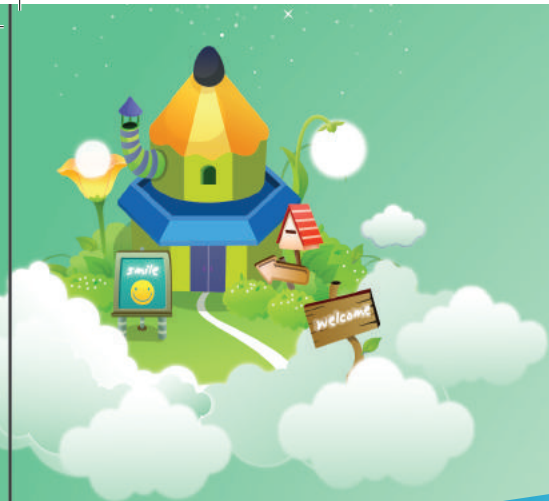

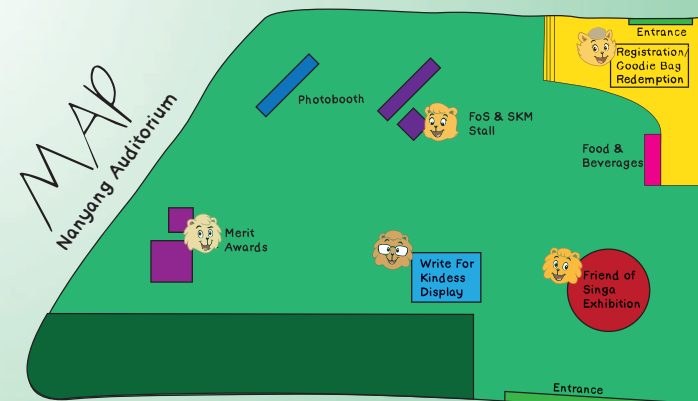

♥ School wide, the students embarked on an angel-mortal game to experience taking care of another person. A blood donation drive encouraged a mass effort from the school to demonstrate empathy. In addition, a replica of a big shoe was also placed strategically at the foyer to allow students to take a photo of themselves pledging their kindness.

♥ On an individual level, students were encouraged to capture acts of empathy using their cameras. Photography workshops were held during the June holidays to equip the students with photography skills. The students captured acts of empathy at Toa Payoh Lorong 8 and Toa Payoh Interchange. The workshops were fruitful as students learnt the virtue of patience, just like acts of kindness, takes time to nurture. The students also had hands-on sessions to practice empathy when they volunteered at the Senior Citizen's Activity Centre in Toa Payoh.

♥ The FOS ambassadors and councillors from Beatty Secondary School organized a range of activities, involving the entire school, to increase empathy towards each other especially across different ethnic groups.

♥ The highlight of their campaign was the Racial Harmony Day Carnival on "Experience, Encounter, Embrace". Minister of State, Mr Lawrence Wong, was invited to grace the occasion. A fusion dance item, blending Chinese Wushu, Malay and Indian dance moves, portrayed the intricate yet harmonious relationship of the three ethnic groups. An original song titled "Embrace the Harmony", written by 10 students across 6 ethnic groups, was launched at the carnival. The song was played in the school throughout the campaign period.



♥ The FOS ambassadors from the Peer Support Leaders recognised that their school does not lack the aspect of empathy. Instead, they would like to increase the existing level of empathy. Hence, their project aims to educate the school population with a more in-depth definition of (self) empathy.

♥ The team approached the project in two phases:

♥ Phase 1 (starting from within):

The students were introduced to the campaign theme of "Empathy" through assembly talks and the Wheel of Empathy. The interactive wheel allowed students to explore different quotes on empathy such as "Empathy is as easy as ABC. Ask how she is, Be there if needed, and Care with your heart".

♥ A self-empathy quiz was also conducted. A self-empathy guide followed closely after to ensure that the basic foundations of self-empathy were reinforced.

Phase 2 (spreading to others):

Phase 2 focuses on empowerment and active action for empathy as the team believed feelings have to be translated to actions.

♥ An empathy corner was set up as a centralized area for SKM activities and materials. The activities included "Say Something Nice", "Empathy Book" and "Messages of Love". A home-made video highlighted areas the school that lacked in empathy, such as towards the non-teaching staff. Students were then encouraged to write appreciation notes to staff and students.

♥ The mega activity of the project was titled "EmPATHY: Pay It Forward". Students and staff were taught how to make Empathy Flowers using recycled plastic bags. The school population were encouraged to do an act of empathy, pass the flower to the recipient and request the person to do the same. 60 hand-folded bouquets were given to 50 students and 10 staff to kick start the process.

♥ This project successfully allowed students to understand the abstract theme of empathy and apply it in daily life.

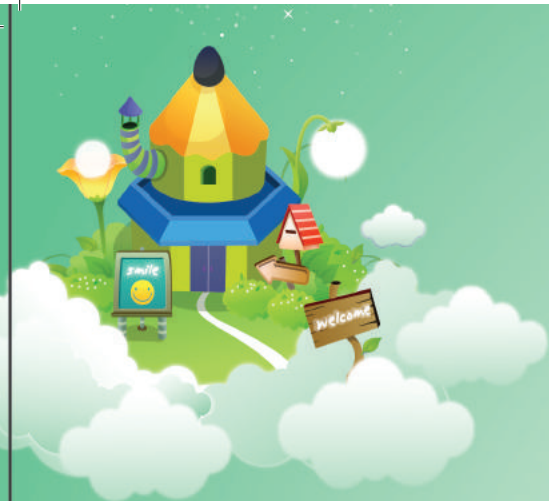

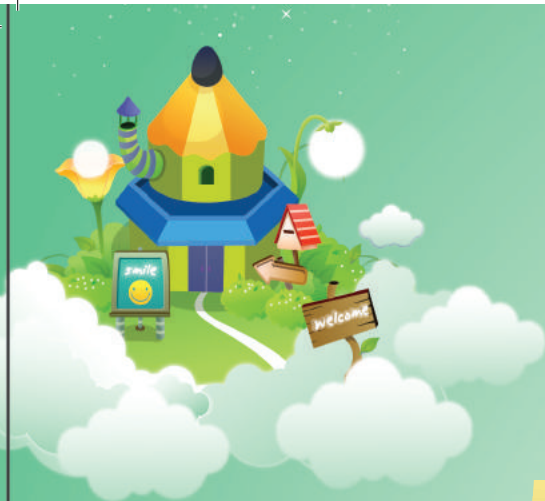
♥ The highlight of the campaign was the "Sea of Love" pledging drive. Each student and staff received a "Sea of Love" activity sheet comprising of two heart-shape templates. A situation was stated on each template. Students and staff were to pen down what they would do when they experience such situations, for example "My friend is upset, I will _____". Upon completion of both templates, students and staff decorated and glued the heart-shapes together to form a fish. The fishes are displayed on the "Sea of Love" murals along classroom walls and corridors.

♥ The "Sea of Love" activity was a great success. Students took responsibility for their character development and also worked collaboratively with one another to put up the murals. Students and staff also built caring relationships among themselves and with each other.

♥ The campaign "Empathy in Action" highlighted the importance of being considerate to other's plights and feelings, especially in this fast paced and material driven society. The FOS ambassadors launched the campaign with an assembly talk. They promoted the value of empathy and inspired the school population to participate in the campaign.

♥ The concept and importance of empathy was further emphasized during art lessons. An art competition, "Empathy in Action", required students to illustrate a person showing empathy to another within the school community. The students also wrote a short description of their art work. Teachers also played their part in the campaign by planning interactive Form Teacher Guidance Period (FTGP) classroom lessons. For example, lower primary students identified emotions based on facial expressions and body language. Upper primary students shared how they felt during a difficult situation with their peers.

♥ The value of empathy was promoted school wide through assembly talks and videos of Singa and the Kindness Cubbies. Students wrote stories of empathy. The best stories were given "Empathy Stars".

♥ Empathy in Action was planned for students to complete worksheets that depict scenarios which relates to pupils' life experiences where they can translate the value of Empathy into action. This activity has impacted them to empathise with the needy and strive to help them alleviate their misery. The students also took part in Let's Shine, Share in neighbourliness* to put values of empathy and graciousness into action.

♥ HIPS FOS then embarked on modifying Monopoly into SingaPoly. SingaPoly aims to inculcate values of empathy, sincerity, charity, graciousness, integrity, self-discipline and resilience. Students had to answer questions such as "why is empathy important" before they received Singa Dollars.

♥ *Let's Shine, Share in neighbourliness was organized by HDB and supported by SKM.

♥ Project "Empathy-Being kind to One Another" allowed students to experience what it is like to be in the shoes of others and see things from their perspective. The FOS ambassadors not only involved the entire school in the project but also customized different activities for different levels:

- Primary 1 & 2: Kindness Monitors
- Primary 3: Made and gave felt flowers to thank non-teaching staff
- Primary 4 & 5: Made kindness posters
- Primary 5 & 6: A Tribute to my teacher

♥ Across the school, kindness monitors and ambassadors gave students yellow "catch them wrong" hearts when they saw someone doing an unkind act; similarly pink "catch them right" hearts were given out when they saw someone doing a kind act.

♥ The Primary 5s shadowed canteen vendors and cleaning staff. They first observed them from an outsider's perspective. Next, they undertook tasks such as sweeping, mopping and helping the canteen vendors. After spending time interacting with the canteen vendors and cleaning staff, the students understood what their work entailed and the impact they made.

♥ "Let's F.E.E.L" was a month-long campaign to cease self-centredness in the school. The team aimed to reach out to the upper primary students and to raise awareness among the lower primary students.

♥ Pre-assembly and assembly talks were held to introduce the value of empathy to the students. "Empathy" was also incorporated into Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) lessons. Reminders created by the FOS ambassadors were shown on television screens around the schools.

♥ Various activities were customised for students and teachers. The lower primary students coloured Singa masks and designed comic strips where empathy is displayed in their stories. The upper primary students made Singa character paper toy as well. They were also given F.E.E.L. cards to encourage them to perform more kind acts.

♥ Teachers were also involved in the campaign through "cART for the Soul". They shared and exchanged hand-made cards which promoted a spirit of giving and sharing among teachers and staff.



♥ "Empathise and Xinergise" project aimed to inculcate a culture of spontaneous kindness within the school community as well as to unite Xinminites to promote empathy together.

♥ Every student pledged to show empathy which is aligned to the school motto, in Word and Deed. An Empa'tree' was displayed in the school compound. Students could record their experience when they showed or was shown empathy. Students also wrote well-wishes for the PSLE students to let them know that Xinminites are behind them in lieu of the examinations period. A short movie clip on empathy was also produced to show that it only takes a few minutes to carry out empathetic acts.

♥ The team wanted to create a game which was easy to handle and keep away after use. Hence, Empathy Snap Card game was conceptualised. Empathy Snap Card depicted empathetic acts. Students had to read out the captions on the cards they had snapped before they could collect them. The fun game taught students that it was easy to show empathy.

♥ We live in a multicultural society, yet many times we are unsure of their common practices. The team at Gan Eng Seng Secondary School conducted a survey which reflected students' perceptions on some common practices about the Malay/Muslim community and misconceptions such as fasting and Ramadan. Hence, the team at Gan Eng Seng Secondary School embarked on a journey to increase students' knowledge of the Malay/Muslim culture.

♥ Information boards were displayed at the school foyer to clear up the misconceptions of the Malay/Muslim practices. For example, the word Halal means lawful, and it is a taboo to eat with the left hand, as the left hand is used for personal hygiene. The right hand is used for greeting, eating and passing objects.

♥ All the staff and students attended the "eating with hands" event where they ate Nasi Lemak with their right hands. An "ALL-Range" artwork was created using more than 3200 pieces of orange ribbons as a symbol of harmony and friendship. It also represented the school's commitment to social cohesion.

♥ Lastly, the students discussed and reflected upon the "curry war" incident. A "galore of curries" event was held to introduce different type of curries and to highlight the difference between Halal and non-Halal curries.

♥ The team at Hong Kah Secondary School hopes to achieve its goal of highlighting the importance of practicing empathy towards others and celebrating kindness shown around school through their project "Empathy – Stop, Look, Listen and Feel the Difference".

♥ The project kicked off with students sharing stories and videos with the school during morning assemblies fortnightly. These stories were also presented on the school's Empathy Boards during recess as well as through social media, Facebook. Self-folded hearts by the team and school leaders were distributed around the school to acknowledge those who have shown an act of empathy.

♥ Their main activity E2R, the games carnival, hope to give pupils an opportunity to learn and practise Empathy by experiencing it through games such as "Three Blind Mice, Blind Maze, Lights Camera Action, Speak no Evil, One-Legged Soldier and Treasure Hunt."

♥ "See my world" was an initiative that gave students an opportunity to understand what it means to be in another person's shoes. This includes activities such as 'handsling' and having different 'shoes' for students to try on. "Walk the Talk" rounded up the project in which students spent an afternoon interacting with the less fortunate at YMCA-Tan Chin Tuan Community Service Programmes.

♥ Project Empathy believed the ability to understand each other's feelings would allow students to care more for one another. With this belief, the team assembled their schoolmates to build a more caring environment through the project.

♥ A fun and impactful activity "In Her Shoes" reminded students to put themselves in others' shoes. 15 pairs of shoes with empathy quotes were placed around the school. Students were invited to participate in a treasure hunt to find the shoes and identify the quotes.

♥ "Freeze there" was a series of scenes which left visual impact and created an opportunity for students to help the characters. The freeze scenes included someone carrying heavy boxes, a girl without a seat etc. When the characters froze, the Care Ambassadors encouraged students to verbalise the image they saw and to help the characters. Videos related to empathy were played during the follow up sessions held during the weekly assemblies.

♥ "COMePASSION Boards", which stands for "Come Pass It On", was a competition to create class boards to stick encouragement notes. Teachers were also encouraged to post encouragement notes for the class. Project Empathy Day concluded the project by summing up the project items. Students took away valuable lessons about empathy and how to display empathy when needed.

♥ A team of FOS ambassadors with the aid of their teachers aimed to increase the level of empathy in their school. It would be an icing on the cake for Towner Gardens School, which teaches students self-control and peer relationships in their existing MINDS curriculum and the PATHS programme.

♥ Through the project, the team taught students empathy as well as empathy for others. Not only were students shown videos and songs about empathy during assembly, the FOS ambassadors also role-played in scenarios that showcased empathy. Students participated in the play by telling the actors whether they should give up a seat in a crowded train upon seeing a girl carrying her baby brother and a big bag. Within the classrooms, students received signatures from their class teachers on their "star charts" as well as tokens in recognition of any acts of empathy shown.

♥ A highlight of the project was when the team shared with the school the story of John, a student who has been of poor health and transferred in and out of hospitals and nursing homes for the past one year. Upon hearing the story, students fervently wrote their well-wishes on a heart shape note and it was combined into one giant card for John. Students not only enjoyed the process of gift-making, but also learnt how to show empathy for others.

♥ The FOS ambassadors of "Care to be Kind" believe that the school should play an active part in bettering the lives of others around them. School wide, the team aimed to raise the awareness of empathy. "Head for empathy" started the ball rolling, school leaders (e.g. Vice Principal) promoted empathy through sharing stories during assembly. A skit for empathy was also put up to depict that empathy is needed when someone is going through a rough time.

♥ Concepts of empathy were reinforced through discussions and clarifications in classes, which was a follow up for the content taught in assembly sessions. A3 Boards (standing for acknowledge, affirm, appreciate) were also put up in every classroom for pupils to display notes which they had written to thank their friends and teachers. This helped to foster a culture of humility and gratitude through the ongoing process of acknowledging, affirming and appreciating the strengths and kind acts of staff and pupils, and at the same time reinforcing that minor manners matter too.

♥ "Care to be Kind" also collaborated with the I&E committee to raise awareness of children suffering from cancer and the difficulties that these children face. Students were encouraged to exercise empathy and cut their hair for a good cause.

♥ "I can understand how you feel" is a project that aims at allowing students to understand what empathy is and efforts were placed on deepening their understanding by showing greater concerns for the less fortunate.

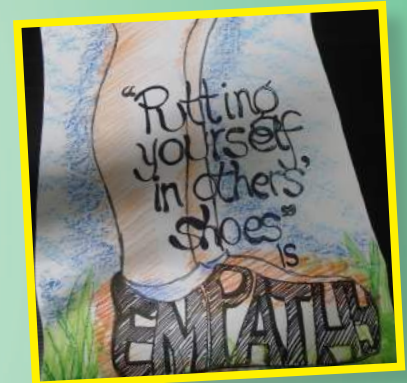
